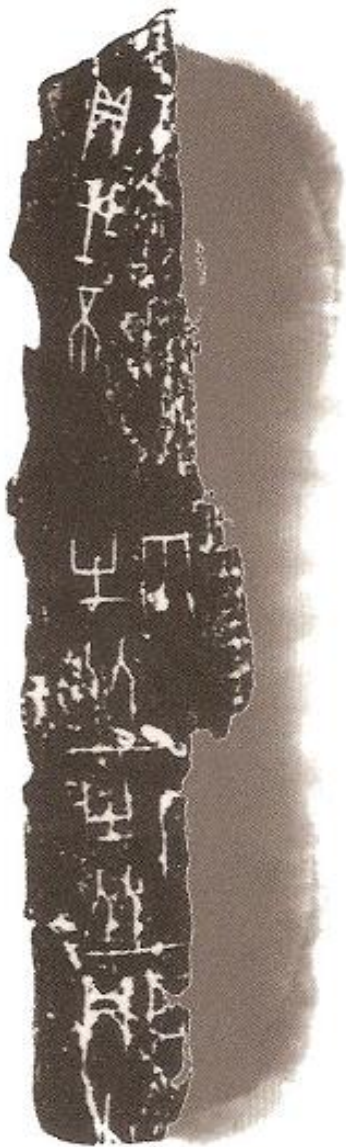

■ **Guideline for Contributions**

1. Area of articles: Confucian tradition such as philosophy and culture
2. Language of articles: English
3. Length of articles: circa 8,000 words, no more than 12,000 words
4. Format of articles
  - (1) Submit manuscripts in docx or hwp file.
  - (2) Font: Times New Roman, font size: 12 pt., line space: double, paper size: Letter (i.e., 8.5 × 11)
  - (3) An abstract of less than 300 words (including 5 key words or more) should be included.
5. Submission and Contact information

## SUBMISSION GUIDELINES FOR CONTRIBUTORS

### I . Submission

1. Manuscripts should be submitted as an email attachment to [jicpc@skku.edu](mailto:jicpc@skku.edu).
2. Author's up-to-date curriculum vitae should also be submitted with the manuscript.
3. On the first page of the body text, make an abstract of about 300 words (including 5 key words or more)
4. Type in "Author's Contact Information" on top of the title of your manuscript, which includes your mailing address, affiliation, e-mail address, telephone and fax numbers.
5. Unless specially invited, a length of each manuscript (including footnotes) should not exceed 12,000 words. (font: Times New Roman, font size: 12 pt., line space: double, paper size: Letter [8.5 × 11]).
6. Manuscripts should be done in docx or hwp file.

### II . Style Guidelines

1. In general, we follow the editorial guidelines described in the 16<sup>th</sup> edition of *The Chicago Manual of Style*. Please consult the online information of the Chicago Manual of Style at [www.chicagomanualofstyle.org](http://www.chicagomanualofstyle.org).
2. On the first page of the main text, make a footnote (by marking a superscript\* on the right top of the author's name) to provide your academic information: the title of your position, department, and university.
3. Please use footnotes rather than endnotes. Parenthetical citations (in the body of the article) are acceptable for frequently cited sources by putting author's last name, publication date, and page number in parentheses, as follows: (Fingarette 1998, 15-16).
4. For the bibliography, please consult *The Chicago Manual of Style*. Book or article titles in languages other than English should be followed by their English translation in parentheses.
5. Romanization of Chinese characters should follow the *pinyin* system. Terms in Korean should be romanized according to the romanization system established in 2000 by the Ministry of Culture and Tourism of Republic of Korea. For Japanese words, please follow the Hepburn romanization system.
6. A glossary of romanized East Asian terms used in the manuscript may be supplied, if needed.
